THESE INCREDIBLE AND IMPRESSIVE CARVED OAK FIGURES WOULD HAVE ORIGINALLY BEEN SUPPORTERS ADORNING AN INCREDIBLE TUDOR BUILDING. EACH FIGURE CARVED IDENTICALLY BOTH SIDES FROM A SINGLE PIECE OF OAK. THE BACKS OF THESE FIGURES WOULD HAVE FACED OUTWARD TO THE ELEMENTS OF NATURE THEREFORE GIVE A GHOSTLY APPEARANCE. THE FRONTS PROBABLY FACED INWARD AND RETAIN ALL THEIR ORIGINAL CARVED



DETAIL. THESE THREE CARVED OAK FIGURES TWO MALE AND ONE FEMALE HAVE BEEN CARVED IN THE STYLE OF GREEK GODS, THE FEMALE FIGURE KNOWN AS CARYATIDS AND THE MALE FIGURES KNOWN AS ATLANTES. THIS GREEK INFLUENCE IN CARVING STYLE WAS POPULAR IN THE LATE TUDOR PERIOD ON ENGLISH FURNITURE DECORATION. SIMILAR CARVED FIGURES CAN BE SEEN ON THE GREAT SCREEN IN MIDDLE TEMPLE HALL, LONDON WHICH WAS COMPLETED IN 1573.
