A BEAUTIFUL EARLY 16TH CENTURY ENGLISH OAK DEVOTIONAL SCULPTURE OF ST ROCH. MOST PROBABLY BURY ST EDMUNDS. CIRCA 1520.

Unusually, the saint is depicted beardless and with youthful features. The facial type and hairstyle directly relate to figurative roof sculptures of from late medieval East Anglia, especially depictions of angels. A large figurative corbel depicting a wildman, originally Bury St Edmunds and now preserved at the V&A, is almost certainly from the same workshop. In Saint Roch's legend, an



angel appears in the guise of a dog to lick his wounds and bring him bread when the saint was afflicted with plaque on pilgrimage to Compostella. The dog is depicted here in the form of a Talbot Hound.
