SALT CELLARS

From left to right:

A.—A standing salt of oak wood (the rounded moulding on the base is of larch) and made of hickwood. Height, 4 1/2 in.; width, 4 1/2 in. English, early 17th century.

B.—Small salt cellar of sycamore wood, 4 1/2 in. high by 4 1/2 in. wide. Early 18th century.

C.—Small standing salt of linden vine wood. Height, 2 1/2 in.; width, 4 1/2 in. English, 17th century.

D.—Standing salt of linden vine wood. Height, 4 in.; width, 4 1/2 in. English, 18th century.

E.—Mortar salt, made of oak, of cylindrical shape, on a low, rounded foot, which has a plain hemispherical moulding. The bowl is 4 1/2 in. high and 4 1/2 in. inside width; total height, 4 1/2 in. A very rare type. English, 18th century.

F.—A standing salt of oak wood on a vase-shaped stem and high foot. Height, 4 1/2 in.; width, 4 1/2 in. English, 17th century.

G.—A double salt of sycamore, with one flat cylindrical receptacle and original spoon from one piece of wood. From an old coaching tavern in Shropshire. English, 17th century.
