THIS FINE CHOIR STALL HAS A WONDERFUL COLOUR AND PATINATION. THE SEATS RETAIN THEIR ORIGINAL FISH-TALE HINGES AND UNDERNEATH THEIR ORIGINAL MISERICORDS.

EACH ARM REST IS CARVED AS FOLLOWS, FROM LEFT TO RIGHT-

A STORK KILLING A SNAKE, THE STORK SIGNIFIES A SERVANT OF GOD WHO PURSUES SNAKES AS EVIL SPIRITS, OPPOSING SIDE IS CARVED WITH A RAVEN SIGNIFYING THE BLACKNESS OF SINNERS.

THE CENTRAL ARMREST IS CARVED WITH A STYLISED TUDOR ROSE OPPOSED BY A POMEGRANATE THESE REPRESENTING HENRY VIII AND THE POMEGRANATE REPRESENTING CATHERINE OF ARAGON.

THE FINAL ARMREST HAS A PORTRAIT CARVING, OPPOSED BY A BAT LIKE CREATURE.
